KEOUGH REGARDING SETTLEMENT ADMINISTRATION STATUS AND TIER 1, 2, AND 3 CLAIM AWARD

DISTRIBUTION - 1

2. I previously filed a Declaration Regarding Proposed Notice Program, dated February 12, 2019, Docket No. 67-3, a Supplemental Declaration Regarding Settlement Administration and Lien Resolution, dated March 18, 2019, Docket No. 85-1, a Declaration in Response to the Court's Order Dated April 18, 2019, dated May 17, 2019, Docket No. 129-2, a Declaration Regarding Notice Program and Settlement Administration, dated November 18, 2019, Docket No. 155-2, and a Supplemental Declaration Regarding Notice Program and Settlement Administration, dated December 23, 2019, Docket No. 163-2. This Declaration is being filed to further update the Court on the status of the Settlement administration, Tier 1, 2, and 3 claims, and the corresponding Claim Award distributions.

SETTLEMENT ADMINISTRATION STATUS

3. Since my last Declaration was filed, JND has continued to administer the Settlement as set forth in the Court's Order Granting Plaintiffs' Renewed Motion for Preliminary Settlement Approval and to Direct Class Notice ("Preliminary Approval Order"), dated June 12, 2019, Docket No. 148, the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, dated January 13, 2020, Docket No. 167-1, and the Court's Final Approval Order and Judgment ("Final

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Approval Order"), dated February 25, 2020, Docket No. 172. Among other tasks, JND has continued to maintain the Settlement website and handle Settlement program communications by phone and email.² In addition, we assisted the Panel with Tier 2 and 3 claim adjudication including scheduling Tier 3 interviews and building a secure portal for the Special Master's Team to review Tier 2 and 3 claims and conduct Tier 3 interviews. Per Section 5.10 of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, we are also continuing lien resolution for Tier 1, 2, and 3 claimants. As further detailed below, JND also completed the Tier 1 Claim Award distribution.

EXCLUSION REQUESTS

4. Since my last Supplemental Declaration was filed, JND was able to match additional individuals who submitted exclusions to Pre-Identified and Potential Class Members on the Notice List using additional information provided

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² As of March 18, 2021, there were a total 609,083 total views of the Settlement Website pages and documents and 82,239 unique visitors to the Settlement Website. The Settlement Program has handled 11,424 email communications received to the Settlement email address. by Counsel. In addition, two invalid exclusions and one late exclusion was subsequently accepted by Counsel.

5. As of March 18, 2021, JND has received 804 timely and valid exclusions and 5 invalid exclusions. Of the 804 timely and valid exclusions, 557 match to Pre-Identified Class Members on the Notice List, 233 match to Potential Class Members on the Notice List, and 14 are self-identified individuals who cannot be matched to the Notice List based on the information provided in the exclusion request. Of the 5 invalid exclusions, 3 match to Pre-Identified Class Members on the Notice List and 2 match to Potential Class Members on the Notice List. Updated lists of the timely and valid and invalid exclusions are available on request.

TIER 1, 2, AND 3 CLAIM STATUS

6. As of March 18, 2021, JND has received a total of 5,316 timely Statement of Settlement Class Membership Forms (Tier 1),³ 1,837 timely Tier 2 claims, and 1,332 timely Tier 3 claims.

³ Per the terms of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, Statement of Settlement Class Membership Forms were required to be submitted by Potential Class Members on the Notice List and Self-Identified individuals not on the Notice List, who were not Pre-Identified as Class Members based on existing USC records, to validate that they met Settlement eligibility requirements.

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- 7. As of March 18, 2021, JND has received a total of 208 late claims postmarked or received after the November 8, 2019 claims deadline (114 Tier 1, 51 Tier 2, and 43 Tier 3).
- 8. Since my last Supplemental Declaration was filed, JND completed its de-duplication analysis of timely and untimely claims and additional claims were de-duplicated by name and address, USC Identification Number, and other unique data fields to remove duplicate claims filed by individuals through multiple submission methods (e.g., online and by mail) and/or Pre-Identified Class Members who erroneously filed a Statement of Settlement Class Membership. In total, 558 timely and late claims were confirmed as duplicates and removed from the total pending Settlement claims (380 Tier 1, 142 Tier 2, and 36 Tier 3). After de-duplication, JND received a total of 5,050 unique Statement of Settlement Class Membership Forms (Tier 1), 1,746 unique Tier 2 claims, and 1,339 unique Tier 3 claims.
- 9. Per Section 6.6 of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement,

 Judge Gonzalez considered the 186⁴ de-duplicated late claims (99 Tier 1, 46 Tier

⁴ Of the 208 total late claims submitted as detailed in Paragraph 7 above, 22 were duplicates (15 Tier 1, 5 Tier 2, and 2 Tier 3).

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2, and 41 Tier 3), in consultation with the Panel team, and accepted the majority (91 Tier 1, 38 Tier 2, and 40 Tier 3).

A. <u>Claim Validation Analysis of Potential and Self-Identified Tier 1</u> <u>Claims</u>

10. Per Section 6.4(a) of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, Class Members that were not Pre-Identified based on existing USC records were required to submit a Statement of Settlement Class Membership to validate that they met Settlement eligibility requirements. As further detailed in my December 23, 2019 Supplemental Declaration Regarding Notice Program and Settlement Administration, JND received Statement of Settlement Class Membership Forms for Tier 1 from claimants who received direct mail and/or email notice as Potential Class Members who were matched to the Notice List and Self-Identified individuals who were not matched to the Notice List.

11. JND has completed its claim validation analysis of these Potential and Self-Identified Tier 1 claims to confirm that these claimants met Settlement eligibility requirements. Of the 5,050 de-duplicated Potential and Self-Identified claimants who filed a Statement of Settlement Class Membership for Tier 1, 1,297 were determined ineligible. Of the 1,297, 1,274 could not be matched to the USC Notice List and self-identified as Class Members. JND was unable to

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verify USC attendance and/or the circumstances by which these claimants alleged they were treated at the USC Student Health Center after multiple methods of research and inquiry including sending a deficiency letter to these claimants requesting additional information. Another 23 claimants were determined ineligible because they did not meet Settlement eligibility requirements or failed to cure a claim deficiency.

12. Of these 1,297 ineligible claimants, 109 also filed a Tier 2 claim (91) or Tier 3 claim (18). These claims were also determined ineligible and not provided to the Panel for review and determination. Eligibility was verified for the remaining 3,753 Potential (3,749) and Self-Identified (4) claimants. Of the 3,753 eligible Tier 1 claimants, 917 also filed a Tier 2 claim (532) or Tier 3 claim (385).

B. Pre-Identified Class Members

13. A total of 13,671 Pre-Identified Class Members were issued direct notice by mail and email.⁵ Another 4 Pre-Identified Class Members were not issued direct notice due to insufficient notice information but were confirmed as Pre-Identified Class Members after contacting JND directly. Of those 13,675

⁵ Of the 13,671 Pre-Identified Class Members issued direct notice by mail, 11,836 were also issued direct notice by email.

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Pre-Identified Class Members, 557 submitted a timely and valid exclusion. Of the remaining 13,118 Pre-Identified Class Members that did not request exclusion, 852 mailed Pre-Identified Class Member Notice Packets were returned undeliverable and/or JND lacks sufficient information to conduct lien resolution after multiple attempts to obtain an updated address or additional information through advanced address search(es) and mail and/or email outreach. Of the remaining 12,266 Pre-Identified Class Members, 2,059 filed a Tier 2 claim (1,123) or Tier 3 claim (936).

14. Below is a de-duplicated summary of Tier 1, 2, and 3 claimants as of March 18, 2021:

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TIER 1 CLAIM AWARD DISTRIBUTION

15. Pursuant to Section 6.4(a) of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, all Pre-Identified Class Members and all confirmed Class Members who filed a Statement of Settlement Class Membership Form will receive an initial guaranteed minimum \$2,500 Tier 1 Claim Award payment.

16. Per Section 6.4(a)(i) of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, JND began issuing Tier 1 Claim Awards (15,006 awards issued by mail and wire) on April 6, 2020 (10 days after the Settlement Effective Date). Additional distributions of Tier 1 Claim Awards issued in July 2020, August 2020, October 2020, December 2020, January 2021, and March 2021 to Tier 1 claimants whose potential Tier 1 liens were resolved and/or who cured a claim form deficiency. In total, 16,017⁶ Tier 1 Claim Awards have been issued or are in the process of being issued totaling \$40,042,500.

17. Of those 16,017 Tier 1 Claim Awards, 14,351 or 89.6% have been negotiated totaling \$35,877,500. 1,637 Tier 1 Claim Awards (or 10%) were mailed, not negotiated, and are now stale totaling \$4,092,500. 29 Tier 1 Claim

⁶ Two eligible Tier 1 claimants were not issued their Tier 1 Claim Award (one by request to receive one total Tier 3 Claim Award and another due to a Tier 1 claim form deficiency that was not cured). These two claimants will not receive the \$2,500 deduction from their Tier 3 Claim Award when issued.

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Awards were recently issued or reissued and are still active (not expired) totaling \$72,500. Of the 1,637 Tier 1 Claim Award checks that are stale, 1,597 claimants are Tier 1 only (did not file a Tier 2 or 3 claim) and 40 filed a Tier 2 or 3 claim and will not receive the \$2,500 deduction from their Tier 2 or 3 Claim Award when issued. For the 1,597 Tier 1 only stale checks, the majority were issued in April 2020⁷ and no check reissue request has been received. Per our discussion with Counsel, the \$3,992,500 Tier 1 Claim Award funds for the 1,597 stale Tier 1 only checks have been voided and these funds will be redistributed to Settlement Class Members as part of the *Pro Rata* Adjustment as detailed below.

TIER 2 AND 3 CLAIM AWARD DISTRIBUTION

18. As detailed above, a total of 2,976 claimants filed Tier 2 (1,655) and Tier 3 (1,321) claims. Of those 2,976, 2 Tier 2 claims were determined ineligible due to claim form deficiencies after multiple outreach attempts to cure the deficiency by email, mail, and phone. The remaining 2,974 claims were provided to the Panel for review (1,653 Tier 2 and 1,321 Tier 3).

⁷ Of these 1,597 Tier 1 stale checks, 1,540 were issued April 6, 2020, 46 were issued July 2, 2020, 7 were issued August 31, 2020, and 4 were issued October 8, 2020.

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Awards in February 2021. Of the 2,974 eligible claimants who filed Tier 2 claims (1,653) and Tier 3 claims (1,321), the Panel determined that 2,925 (1,606 Tier 2 and 1,319 Tier 3) or 98% were entitled to an enhanced damages award per Section 6.4 (b) and (c) of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement. The remaining 49 claimants or 2% were determined not eligible for an enhanced damages award (47 Tier 2 and 2 Tier 3). Pursuant to the Section 6.4 (b) and (c) of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, the 49 claimants determined not eligible for an enhanced damages award retain their Tier 1 Claim Award and will receive a *Pro Rata* Adjustment as detailed below.

20. For the 1,606 claimants who filed a Tier 2 claim and qualified for an enhanced damages award, the Panel awarded a total of \$19,539,000 and the average award was \$12,166.25. For the 1,319 claimants who filed a Tier 3 claim and qualified for an enhanced damages award, the Panel awarded a total of \$127,060,000 and the average award was \$96,330.55. In total, the Panel awarded \$146,599,000 in Tier 2 and 3 Claim Awards.

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PRO RATA ADJUSTMENT

21. Pursuant to Section 6.5(d) of the Second Amended Settlement Agreement, once all Tier 2 and Tier 3 Claim Awards have been determined by the Panel the total sum of all the Claim Awards will be compared to the total amount remaining in the Settlement Fund. If the total sum of the Claim Awards is less than the total amount in the Settlement Fund, a *Pro Rata* Increase will be calculated and applied to all Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3 Claim Awards by the same percentage until the total sum of all Claim Awards equals the Settlement Fund, or until all Claim Awards have been increased by 50%, whichever occurs first.

22. As of March 18, 2021, \$29,819,540 remains in the \$215,062,360 Settlement Fund after deducting \$40,042,500 issued for Tier 1 Claim Awards, \$146,599,000 the Panel awarded for Tier 2 and 3 Claim Awards, \$5,848,871 paid for Administrative Expenses (through January 2021), \$3,247,449 reserved for Administrative Expenses through December 2021, \$35,000 reserved to resolve remaining Tier 1 Government Payor liens, \$770,000 reserved for the 50 Class Representative Service Awards, and adding back \$3,992,500 for the 1,597 stale Tier 1 only checks, and \$7,307,500 for the 2,923 Tier 2 and 3 claimants

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who were issued their Tier 1 Claim Award and are receiving a Tier 2 and 3 Claim Award.⁸

23. Based on the above estimates, \$205,161,040 remains in the Settlement Fund after deducting Administrative Expenses and reserves as detailed in Paragraph 22 above. The resulting aggregate award amount is \$175,341,500 and all Claim Awards would receive a *Pro Rata* Adjustment upward of approximately 17% as detailed below:

24. Based on the approximate *Pro Rata* Increase of 17%, the Tier 1 *Pro Rata* Increase will be approximately \$425. For a Tier 2 Claim Award of \$20,000, the 17% *Pro Rata* Increase is approximately \$3,400 resulting in a Total 2 Claim Award of \$23,400. For a Tier 3 Claim Award of \$250,000, the 17% *Pro Rata* Increase is approximately \$42,500 resulting in a Total Tier 3 Claim Award of \$292,500.

25. After deducting the \$7,307,500 offset for the 2,923 Tier 2 and 3 claimants who were already issued their Tier 1 Claim Award, the combined Tier 1 *Pro Rata* Increase distribution to 11,497 Tier 1 only Class Members and the

¹¹ When the final *pro rata* calculation occurs, the *Pro Rata* Increase percentage will calculate to exactly the amount remaining in the Settlement Fund including the final interest amount accumulated prior to the distribution.

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
